

# WHO *is* THE LORD?

The LORD descended in the cloud and stood there with him as he called upon the name of the LORD. Then the LORD passed by in front of him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, [compassionate and gracious, ] (slow to anger,) and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, <who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin,> yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, (visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children & on the grandchildren to the third & fourth generations.)"

Moses made haste to bow low toward the earth and worship. He said, "If now I have found favor in Your sight, O Lord, I pray, let the Lord go along in our midst, even though the people are so obstinate, and pardon our iniquity and our sin, and take us as Your own possession."

Exodus 34:5-9

'The Lord is slow to anger

- Read the original Exodus 34 passage and observe the marked phrases.
- Go through the shaded boxes and mark each quotation with the same markings from the Exodus 34 passage. For example, put brackets every time you see [compassionate and gracious,] make a circle every time you see (slow to anger) and so on.

DIRECTIONS:

In Exodus 34, we get insight as to how God would introduce Himself. As He meets with Moses to renew the covenant, He says His name, describes His good character and gives a warning. This is one of the most quoted passages in Scripture. For generations to come, prophets and kings would use God's own description of Himself in their writings.
